



REMEMBERING TED ROSENBERG



Theodore "Ted" Rosenberg, who was initiated as a member of the Baltimore Chapter of Lambda Alpha in 1995, passed away on June 18, 2020, at the age of 78. At the time of his joining LAI, Ted was President of MLR, Inc., providing consulting services in economics, planning and financial modeling.

Ted grew up in Dickeyville in the same house that he later raised his own family. He was the oldest of four children. His family reports that he was musically gifted at a very young age. He taught himself how to play piano at age 5 and from there went on to master any and all stringed instruments. He sang with local groups until his health prevented it. He was active in scouting throughout his growing up years, enjoying camping and caving. When first married and still living in Boston he managed a local coffee house in the early 1960's which booked newcomers like Bob Dylan and Joe and Eddie, among just a few.

He was rarely seen without a book by his side and in later years when his eyesight was failing, his wife would read to him for hours on end, science fiction and British mysteries being among his favorites. His quest for knowledge was unending. He attended and enjoyed many lecture series at The Walters, the JCC, his synagogue and interfaith groups, among just a few.

Ted gained his formal education at Baltimore Friends School and the University of Oklahoma, supplemented by studies at Loyola University, Carnegie Tech, Boston University, and a number of courses sponsored by the American Life Insurance Council Investment Officers Program. In fact, prior to founding MLR, Inc., much of Ted's professional life was associated with the work of the Chesapeake Life Insurance Group, the company founded by his parents.

His later professional endeavors were in conjunction with the work of attorneys and accountants, providing appraisals of real estate and a wide range of special assets. His other professional and civic affiliations included Social Science Research, Inc., Baltimore Business Opportunity Center, and the Morgan State University School of Business Advisory Board.

Ted is survived by his loving children Elizabeth Rosenberg, Jacob (Samantha) Rosenberg, Seth (Aliza) Rosenberg and Marian Rosenberg; siblings Victor Rosenberg (Nina Edwards) and Laurie Rosenberg; grandchildren James Rosenberg, Elesia Bowers, Erika Bowers and Max Rosenberg and great-grandson Tyler Wessels. He is predeceased by his loving wife Michele Rosenberg (nee Kayne), brother Leonard Rosenberg, Jr., and parents Leonard and Edna Rosenberg.
