

A TRIBUTE TO DAVID B. RUDOW

LAI Baltimore Chapter recognizes the passing of our long-time member David B. Rudow on October 4, 2021. David was one of our Chapter's earliest members, joining in 1993. He was honored as the Baltimore LAI Member of the Year in 2013 for his pro bono legal counsel to establish the Baltimore Chapter as a 501(c)6 organization.

David practiced as an attorney specializing in business and tax law for 60 years with the law firm Adelberg Rudow. He had extensive experience with real estate and healthcare professionals and also represented clients in all aspects of estate planning and administration.

David was extensively involved in both local and national professional organizations and in efforts to better his community. Over the course of his career he was chair of the Maryland State Bar Association's Section of Taxation, chair of the Baltimore Estate and Gift Tax Study Group and member of the Board of Directors of the Baltimore Estate Planning Council. He was active in the Baltimore City Homeowner's Coalition for Fair Property Taxes which promoted legislation such as the City's Homestead Tax Credit; the Baltimore Efficiency and Economy Foundation which is dedicated to helping the City operate more efficiently and effectively; and Project Scope which was a forerunner of the current Vacants to Value program that created a method for the City to sell government owned properties, returning them to productive use. David also founded and served as president of the Roland Park Community Foundation and was a past president of the Har Sinai Congregation;

Those David leaves behind include his son, Stephen Rudow, a past president of the Baltimore Lambda Alpha Chapter.
