Reimagine Middle Branch South Baltimore Gateway Partnership

South Baltimore Gateway Partnership (SBGP) and the City of Baltimore recently released the Reimagine Middle Branch Plan for public comment. The Plan lays out a bold vision for transforming the Middle Branch into Baltimore's next great waterfront, with 11 miles of parks, trails, and equitable economic development. More information here. At the same time, they celebrated two major milestones for the Middle Branch. SBGP announced \$48 million in funds to build its first 35 acres of wetlands. which will help to protect BGE Spring Gardens and MedStar Harbor Hospital from storms and flood damage, while achieving important environmental justice goals for the residents of South Baltimore. In addition, they helped Baltimore City Recreation and Parks to celebrate the opening of the \$25 million Middle Branch Fitness and Wellness Center in Cherry Hill.
